The 2023 Broadmoor Open will be conducted in accordance with the rules and regulations of U.S. Figure Skating, as set forth in the [current rulebook](#), as well as any pertinent updates that have been posted on the U.S. Figure Skating [website](#). All event elements are as posted in this announcement for the 2023 competitive season.

This competition is open to all eligible, restricted, reinstated or readmitted persons as defined by the Eligibility Rules, and who are currently registered members of a U.S. Figure Skating member club, a collegiate club or who is an individual member in accordance with the current rulebook. Please refer to the current rulebook for non-U.S. citizens.

SERIES INFORMATION: The 2023 Broadmoor Open has applied to be an NQS event. If approved, it will take place in the Fall. Please watch the BSC website to see if we are approved.

ELIGIBILITY/TEST LEVEL:

2023-2024 Competition Season Updates | Critical Information

U.S. Figure Skating made several changes to the rules regarding test level and competition for singles athletes at the 2022 U.S. Figure Skating Governing Council. Please review this resource sheet for resources and direct questions to events@usfigureskating.org. - For example, a skater still must pass their juvenile free skate test to compete in juvenile or skate up to intermediate.
- Completion of an EMS Series Application at a particular level in the National Qualifying Series (NQS) and/or the Excel National Series will set the athlete's "competitive floor" for future events. An athlete's competitive floor is the lowest level they can compete at and is only dictated by the paid EMS Series Application (this is NOT tied to individual competition registrations).
- Competitive Floor = lowest level an athlete can compete at.
- If an athlete has participated in both series at different levels, they may choose the lowest level for their floor.

Scenario #1 – Athlete with a Competitive Floor

Highest Free Skate Test: Senior

Past Excel Series Application: N/A

Past NQS Application: Novice

Future NQS Application: Novice Scenario #2 – Athlete without a Competitive Floor

Highest Free Skate Test: Junior

2022 Excel Series Application: N/A

2022-2023 NQS Application: N/A

In scenario #1, the athlete may compete at Novice and above. If this athlete wants to explore their range in the Spring/Summer, they have that option. They can opt to compete at one event as Junior and that will not impact their competitive floor – regardless of series or EMS.

Scenario #2 is an extreme example but when the athlete registers for a non-qualifying competition that offers ALL singles events and skating up is permitted, they will see Pre-Preliminary - Senior. This is where level/score banding will play a large role. More information will be available in Spring 2023 on this topic.

Age restrictions/requirements:

Skaters entering pre-juvenile and lower events will be divided as closely as possible by age should the number of entries warrant more than one group.

FOREIGN SKATERS:

Non-U.S. skaters intending to register for this competition must set up a non-member account prior to registering for the competition ([click here for HOW TO](#)). This can be done by choosing the "Create Account (Non-Member)" option on the [Members Only](#) login page.

PAIRS/DANCE/SHADOW DANCE:

PARTNERED EVENTS:

Only one partner will complete registration for the team. During the registration process, you will be asked to identify your partner and verify their test information. **The registered partner will be responsible for managing all aspects of the competition for the team including music/PPC upload, practice ice sales, etc.**

Mandatory Athletes:

Athletes age 18+ as of the competition start date who will be competing on a team (i.e. synchro, dance, pairs, shadow dance, theatre, etc.) with at least one minor athlete must complete SafeSport training. *

Minor Athletes who turn 18 mid-season are encouraged to seek parental consent to take the online SafeSport training early to avoid any disruptions in their ability to participate as the training is required upon turning 18. The athlete will not be SafeSport compliant until they have completed the training and their Members Only portal reflects completion. Please email skatesafe@usfigureskating.org for instructions or questions regarding parental consent.

REFUND POLICY: Entry fees will not be refunded for any reason after entry deadline unless no competition exists or the event is canceled. There will be no refunds for medical withdrawals.

SCHEDULE: Competitors may be scheduled on any day or time during the announced dates of the competition. The competition and practice ice schedule will be available after the close of entries. All participants will be notified via email once available.

FACILITIES: The competition will be held at the Broadmoor World Arena and Colorado Springs Ice Halls, 3185 Venetucci Blvd. There are three rinks available: the NHL Rink (200x85), the Olympic Rink (200x100), and the World Arena (200x100).

EMS MUSIC UPLOAD:

DEADLINE: 06/23/2023

Competitors participating in events with music are required to upload their music to EMS no later than **6/23/23 at 11:59 pm ET**. After this date, skaters will be locked out of this feature and subject to a **\$15 late fee**. The late fee will automatically be added to each skater's cart who doesn't meet this requirement by the deadline. Late fees will not be removed under any circumstances and must be paid prior to receiving the skater credential onsite.

All music must meet the following criteria. If you have questions about what format you have, please contact your coach and get a new version of your music that meets the criteria listed below.

MUSIC CRITERIA:

- File Format: MP3
- Bit Rate: 192 kbps or higher and Sample Rate: 44,100 kHz
 - This will be verified by the music chair and they may request you upload a corrected file.
- Leaders and trailers (the silence or "dead space" before and after the actual start and end of the program music) may not exceed two (2) seconds. We prefer that there be NO leaders or trailers at all. Excessive leaders and trailers may disrupt the playing of the music during competition.

Competitors must also have available a backup copy of their competition music on a cellphone and it must be immediately available rink side whenever the skater competes. If the phone does not have the standard round headset connector an appropriate adapter, such as an Apple Lightning connector or Samsung USB-C adapter is required to be attached. The phone should be presented to the music person with the file ready to play, phone in airplane mode, and volume turned to maximum.

MUSIC SUBMISSION:

If not utilizing an online upload, please include instruction on competitor music submission. This may include pre-event email to the music chair/official, or provided onsite.

EMS PLANNED PROGRAM CONTENT (PPC) – IF IJS:

DEADLINE: June 23, 2023

Competitors participating in IJS events are required to submit PPC in EMS no later than **June 23, 2023 ET**. After this date, skaters will be locked out of this feature in EMS and subject to a **\$15 late fee**. The late fee will automatically be added to each skater's cart who doesn't meet this requirement by the deadline. Late fees will not be removed under any circumstances and must be paid prior to receiving the skater credential onsite.

ONSITE CHECK-IN: Check-in will open on June 25, 2023 at 8 AM. If practice ice is available on June 24th, registration will open on 6/24 at 6 PM.

IF NOT OFFERING LOCKER ROOMS:

Locker rooms and changing areas will not be available at this competition. All athletes are expected to arrive to the arena ready (costumes, hair, make-up etc.). Athletes will be provided with an area to put skates on.

PRACTICE ICE: Practice Ice will be sold in advance (i.e. pre-purchase) until May 21, 2023. For additional information regarding practice ice offerings, visit your competition website.

Note, per U.S. Figure Skating policy, photographing and/or recording of anyone other than your own skater is strictly prohibited.

AWARDS:

Medals will be given in all events for 1st through 4th places off-ice in the Awards area. Special trophies will be awarded for outstanding performances in the Juvenile through Senior freeskate events:

Jenkins trophy - outstanding free skate performance by a Senior competitor.

Monty Hoyt trophy - outstanding free skate performance by a Junior competitor.

Jack Might trophy - outstanding free skate performance by a Novice competitor.

Annette Cramer trophy - outstanding free skate performance by an Intermediate competitor.

Mary Zarpaylic trophy - outstanding free skate performance by a Juvenile competitor.

With the exception of the Cramer trophy, winners will be those with the highest total Performance/Execution and Interpretation components scores. Ties will be broken by the Choreography/Composition component score. The Cramer trophy winner will be selected by members of the Cramer family.

OFFICIAL NOTICES: An official bulletin board will be maintained at Gate A of the World Arena next to Registration. It is the responsibility of each competitor, parent and coach to check the bulletin board frequently for any schedule changes and/or additional information. Skaters are requested to arrive 45 minutes prior to the scheduled time of their event and must check in at Registration prior to skating.. A tentative schedule of events will be posted prior to the competition.

All results will be posted online through IJS Live.

TEST CREDIT: For eligible events and additional information, click [HERE](#). Skaters that meet the requirements for test credit may request their test credit forms prior to the start of the event at registration. **Forms must be picked up at the registration desk prior to the end of the competition.** There will be a \$5 fee for the test credit packet. Registration is located at Gate A of the World Arena.

IMPORTANT NOTICE FOR ALL COACHES:

To be a credentialed coach at a sanctioned nonqualifying competition, coaches must meet the compliance requirements listed below and verified by the U.S. Figure Skating.

With EMS, a coach must be included within a skater's registration or updated through their EMS Skater Portal via "[My Coaches](#)." All coaches declared at the time of registration will be included on the skater's registration confirmation email. Note, there is no registration approval process within EMS as the data (membership and test level) is tied to the U.S. Figure Skating database. Non-compliant coaches will receive automated email reminders through the start of the competition.

EMS ADMIN: The compliance tab within EMS lists ALL individuals who were declared by skaters at the time of registration or through their EMS Skater Portals (also allows access to skater schedule, music/PPC preview etc.). The compliance requirements are tied to the U.S. Figure Skating database and are updated daily removing the

need for the LOC to manually update their list of attending coaches. Further, if a coach is non-compliant, they will receive system generated emails through the start of the competition. Click [here](#) for additional information

Coach/Choreographer (domestic/non-foreign):

- ✓ Must be a current full member of U.S. Figure Skating either through a member club or as an individual member.
- ✓ If 18 years or older, must submit information for, proper payment of \$30 and successfully pass a background check. *
- The background check will be valid for two seasons, the one in which it was completed plus one additional.
- ✓ If 18 years or older, must complete annual SafeSport Training. *
- The training will be valid for 365 days from date of completion and there is no cost for the training/certification.
- ✓ Must complete the Professional Coach/Choreographer Coaching Education Requirement (CER) through the [Professional Skaters Association \(PSA\)](#).
- ✓ Must submit proof of general liability insurance with limits of \$1 million per occurrence/ \$5 million aggregate.
- ✓ Must agree to the U.S. Figure Skating Code of Ethics. *
- ✓ Must complete three waivers: 1) Assumption of Risk, Waiver and Release and Indemnification Agreement, 2) Medical Consent and 3) Name and Likeness Release and Consent Agreement. *
- ✓ If attending a qualifying competition or traveling as a part of Team USA and/or International Selection Pool (ISP), must be a full member of the [Professional Skaters Association \(PSA\)](#).

Learn to Skate USA Coach:

- ✓ Must be a current full member of U.S. Figure Skating either through a member club or as an individual member OR Learn to Skate USA instructor membership
- ✓ If 18 years or older, must submit information for, proper payment of \$30 and successfully pass a background check. *
- The background check will be valid for two seasons, the one in which it was completed plus one additional.
- ✓ If 18 years or older, must complete annual SafeSport Training. *
- The training will be valid for 365 days from date of completion and there is no cost for the training/certification.
- ✓ Learn to Skate USA Instructor Certification completed OR U.S. Figure Skating compliance coach (details above)

- ✓ Required to present the LOC with a letter from their federation verifying they are a member in good standing.

Singles events will be conducted as follows:

If fewer than 25 athletes enter an event, there will be only one group, with a Free Skate only for Juvenile and a combined Short Program + Free Skate for Intermediate – Senior.

If more than 24 athletes enter an event, skaters will be divided into groups as follows:

- 25 – 36 entries: 2 groups
- 37 – 54 entries: 3 groups
- 55 – 72 entries: 4 groups
- 73 – 90 entries: 5 groups
- 91 – 144 entries: 6 groups

Juvenile: Each skater will compete a Free Skate program only, in whichever group they have been assigned to. The score earned in that free skate is considered their Final, Total Score (TS).

Intermediate – Senior: All skaters in all groups will skate a combined Short Program + Free Skate = Total Score. The TS earned in whichever group the skater is assigned to is considered their official score. There will be no Final Rounds.

COMBINED SHORT PROGRAM & WELL BALANCED FREE SKATE EVENTS- Combined Events will be available for Intermediate through Senior levels. All skaters will compete both the short program and the freeskate within their group. **There will be no final rounds.** The ISU Judging System will be used for all Intermediate, Novice, Junior, and Senior Combined Events. Intermediate, Novice, Junior, & Senior skaters should be sure to fill out their Planned Program Content Forms & submit their music online. Juvenile Freeskate will also be offered as a FS only event. Long programs will be skated and skaters will compete only in their group. **There will be no final round.** Short programs for Juvenile/Open Juvenile skaters are a separate event.

General event parameters: **ALL SP & FS EVENTS (NO TEST-SR) WILL BE JUDGED BY THE IJS SYSTEM. COMPULSORIES, SPINS, JUMPS, and SHOWCASE WILL BE JUDGED BY 6.0**

1. Skaters may not enter both a Well Balanced Free Skate event and an Excel Free Skate event at the same nonqualifying competition.
2. Skaters will skate to the music of their choice. Vocal music is permitted.

3. Level will be determined by the highest free skate test passed as of 5/03/2023. Skaters may compete at the highest level they have passed, or skate up to one level higher.
4. IJS judging system will be used for these events (No test-Juv/OpJuv)
5. All relevant and appropriate IJS rules will be used. Coaches and athletes are expected to be aware of these rules by reading the documents on Skating Rules & Resources page of the specific discipline or program located under Skating Opportunities on [Members Only](#).

[Excel Free Skate](#) These events are NOT part of the Excel Series.

General event parameters:

Skaters may not enter both a Well-Balanced Free Skate event and an Excel Free Skate event at the same nonqualifying competition.

Skaters will skate to the music of their choice. Vocal music is permitted at all levels.

Level will be determined by the highest Free Skate test passed. Skaters may compete at the highest level they have passed, or “skate up” to one level higher.

Minimum number of spin revolutions are in () following the spin description. Revolutions must be in position.

The following deductions will be taken:

- 0.1 from each mark for each technical element included that is not permitted in the event description.
- 0.2 from the technical mark for each extra element included.
- 0.1 from the technical mark for any spin that is less than the required minimum revolutions.

See Excel Program Requirements & offered event levels as outlined in the current 2023 Rulebook.

JUVENILE/OPEN JUVENILE SHORT PROGRAM ONLY- Short program only events will be offered at the Juvenile & Open Juvenile levels. Required element times will be as set forth in the Rulebook for the 2023 competitive season. There will be no final round for the short program only events. Juvenile and Open Juvenile short programs will use the same elements and times as prescribed in the Rulebook for the Intermediate short program. Open Juvenile will be put in a separate age division from Juvenile if possible. **IJS Judging System will be used for Juvenile & Open Juvenile Short Program Only events.**

COMPULSORY MOVES – SINGLES

Compulsory Moves (No Test – PreJuvenile)

General event parameters: 1. No Test – Pre-Juvenile: Elements skated on ½ ice 2. The skater must demonstrate the required elements (performed once only) and may use any additional elements from previous levels. 4. A 0.2 deduction will be taken for each element performed from a higher level. 5. Music is not allowed. 6. Skaters may compete at their test level or one level higher.

PAIRS /Partner Dance Events

These events are combined short and long program. All Teams are welcome. Dance events are combined RD & FD for Jr & Sr. For Juv-Nov dance events the combined event is Pattern Dance & Freeskate

Pre-Juv Dance consists of two rounds of pattern dances.

Test level is as of 5/3/23. The ISU Judging System will be used for all Novice through Senior Pair short program events & PreJuvenile through Senior freeskating events. Please consult the 2023 Rulebook for SP & well balanced program requirements for 2022 season.

SINGLES JUMPS CHALLENGE-: PLEASE NOTE THAT ELEMENTS AND TIMES FOR THE JUMP EVENTS DIFFER FROM THOSE LISTED IN THE STANDARDIZED ANNOUNCEMENT.

Entrants will qualify according to their freeskating level as of 5/3/2023. PrePreliminary through PreJuvenile will be skated on half ice. All other levels will skate on full ice. Jumps should be performed exactly as stated. Skaters will be given two opportunities to perform each jump and will be judged on the best one. If they are satisfied with their first attempt, the second attempt need not be executed, however, the skater must inform the referee of their intention to only execute 1 attempt. Maximum time is **1:15 minute for Beginner – PrePreliminary, 2 minutes for Preliminary through Intermediate, 2:30 minutes for Novice, and 5 minutes for Junior through Senior.**

1. Waltz jump (from backward crossovers) 2. ½ flip or ½ Lutz 3. Single Salchow

High Beginner

1:15 max.

1. Waltz jump (from backward crossovers) 2. Single Salchow 3. Jump combination – waltz jump-toe loop

1:15 max.

1. Single toe loop 2. Single loop 3. Jump combination – Any two ½ or single revolution jumps (no Axel)
